bawut noun winter **Bawut jouwa bou'wurr.** Winter is when it rains.

be'l noun cousin **abe'l** cousin! (when speaking to him/her)

bou'wurr noun rain **Bou'wurr gawu loutsutsgalih.** Rain fell in drops.

bouchvi noun skunk **Bouchvi daheraqh.** Skunk was sick.

boutshurr noun fawn **Boutshurr diqe teluwilh.** Fawn jumped down.

buroug verb listen **Ga rruburouqilh.** They don't listen.

da'gurr noun sea otter **Hi wulu da'gurr.** Then I saw an otter.

da'mul noun black bear **Da'mul rra'durr.** The black bear is large.

da'sh 1 noun father

2 noun son **ada'sh!** father! / son! (when speaking to him)

dagutw noun barnacle **Gutsurr dagutw halouwiwaqh.** There are a lot of barnacles on the boat.

dalhalilh noun waterfall **Douwa dalhalilh?** Where is the waterfall?

dayughu'lu' noun whale **Dayughu'lu' jouwa dali'm.** A whale is lying there.

di'l noun eagle **Hilagilh di'l.** He told eagle.

dishg verb love **Da dishgaghougilh**. He is in love with her.

dougapa'l noun hazelnut **Dougapa'l shou wi'w**. I wish I could eat some hazelnuts.

douk 1 noun brother

2 noun sister **adouk!** sister! / brother! (when speaking to him/her)

duklhulouk verb six (6) **duklhulouk dahulu vewi'gurr** Saturday ('six days of work')

duqht noun cottontail rabbit **Wayits duqht raqshemilh**. The dog is chasing a rabbit.

ga 1 noun mother

2 noun daughter **aga!** mother! / daughter! (when speaking to her)

gatsirr noun crow **Gatsirr di'l wiwal**. Crow's wife was Eagle.

gilhiswilh noun spider **Gilhiswilh velou'm**. I'm afraid of spiders.

giyawl interjection no **Giyawl lhith dagiyawlhith** **bou'wulh**. There's no longer cooking sticks.

gou'daw noun eel **goutsuwulenu'r sleet** = 'small eel eyes'

goutsurr verb one (1) **wayits goutsurr** (there is) one dog

guvouchugu'w noun doe **Guvouchugu'w da** **lhikulilh**. The doe is running.
