Medicare Part D Signups and Elk BBQ



Need help with Medicare Part D? Not sure which drug plan covers your prescriptions? The Wiyot Tribe would like to help. Medicare Part D is a federal program to subsidize the costs of prescription drugs for Medicare beneficiaries in the United

States. It was enacted as part of the Medicare Prescription Drug, improvement and Modernization Act of 2003 and went into effect on January 1st, 2009. The Wiyot Tribe will host a Medicare Part D information session as well as part D Signups on June 26th at 12 noon.

Good Breast Health Care

The Humboldt County Breast Health Project is a local community resource agency that provides education, support and hope regarding breast health. HCBHP encourages women to become self-aware, by becoming familiar with your own breasts. At age 20 do a breast self exam about a week after the end of your period. Get a clinical breast exam every year if you are 40 or older and every 3 years from age 20 to 39. Women aged 40 and older are encouraged to have a mammogram every year. The organization also encourages women to have a routine pelvic exams and pap tests. Report unusual symptoms to your medical provider. If you are a parent of a girl age 11-26, talk to your doctor about the cervical cancer prevention vaccine.
