Humboldt County Citizens Protest Arkley in Support of the Indian Island Land Transfer

On September 20, 2017 a Protest was held in Eureka to show their support for the Indian Island Land Transfer currently being negotiated by the City of Eureka with the Wiyot Tribe. Despite the fact that Rob Arkley's statements and comments have dominated the news, the Tribe has received nothing but positive feedback and support of the transfer from the community at large. This protest was organized by local people who wanted to have their voices heard in

support of the transfer of Tuluwat to the Wiyot Tribe and in opposition to Rob Arkley's offer to purchase the island at \$300,000 more than the appraised value of the

property. The Tribe is working together to heal the island, restore wildlife habitat, return Wiyot Cultural practices

and build Community. In regards to the land transfer, Chairman Hernandez stated, "I would like to thank the community of Humboldt County for the support of the return of Tuluwat back to the Wiyot people and the City of Eureka, staff and council for their commitment to working on the return of our Sacred Ceremonial Grounds. Both of our staff have worked diligently and respectfully on this transfer to ensure the healing of Humboldt county."

Wiyot Natural Resource and Cultural Departments Receive National Park Service Tribal Heritage Grant

The Wiyot Cultural Department was happy to receive news that in partnership with the Natural Resource Department, it was awarded a 40K National Park Service (NPS) Tribal Heritage Grant. This is the first grant the Tribe has ever received from the NPS, which will help to launch the Wiyot Cultural Site Identification and Geographic Information Systems (GIS) Mapping Project. Tribal botanist and GIS specialist, Adam Canter, drafted the grant which was submitted by the prior THPO, Tom Torma.

The main goals of this grant will be to digitize all historic cultural maps from various sources for use in a GIS computer database. Presently this data is kept on paper analog maps, which places them at risk from various threats, including theft and fire. Digitization into a computer database will ensure the security of Wiyot ethnogeographical data for future generations. An exciting component of the grant includes funds providing for research into previously unknown sources of Wiyot cultural site information, including a partnership with Humboldt State Universities (HSU) Cultural Resource Facility and the Humboldt Historical Society. Digitization of maps will also take place at HSU, using their state of the art scanning equipment thru the Department of Geography's Institute for Spatial Analysis. These partnerships will both

help to hopefully uncover lost cultural site data, while building the capacity of the Tribes Cultural and Natural Resource Departments.

The interdisciplinary nature of this project was envisioned as a result from work botanist Adam Canter has done over the last two years, showing a correlation between culturally significant plant communities, like hazelnut (*Corylus cornuta* ssp., *californica*) coastal scrub, Indian potato meadows, and bramble berry patches, and known historic Wiyot village and camp sites. This ethnobotanical site data may help the Tribe to identify the vicinity of past cultural sites and also serve as a database to aid in the future establishment of sites in the historic register, or identify high priority conservation parcels. A third partnership will involve research into the locations of culturally important plant species in Wiyot Ancestral Territory at the HSU Herbarium. We will keep Tribal citizens updated on this exciting new grant project, which will take place over the next two years. This project will help provide greater protections for Wiyot Cultural Sites, with the possibility of identifying past sites which until now were lost to history




Figure: Map of hazelnut areas on public lands along Hookton Road, an area known to have a high concentration of historic Wiyot Village Sites

The Health & Human Services Department oversees the Tsek Houdaqh youth program and food programs. Weekly after school snacks and homework assistance is provided.

The Wiyot Tribe Elder Program invites you to a veteran and community luncheon, on November 8th to honor those who have served in the military. If you are an Elder and would like to attend the function please call us before 9:00 a.m. to schedule transportation to our lunch site. Also, on November 22nd we will be having a Thanksgiving luncheon.

Stay Active In Life (SAIL) - SAIL is a strength building exercise activity designed for Elderly citizens to help prevent falls. Please contact the HHS department if you want to participate in the strength building activity in your home and not in a public setting. We are still trying to set up a class time for interested Elders before lunch on a day TBA.

Wiyot Walkers are encouraged to gather and walk together after the week day lunch.

The Wiyot Tribe community garden has provided harvests of vegetables and fruit that are used in our Elder and Youth meals programs. Wiyot citizens may call the office on Fridays to request produce not used by the end of the week.

United Indian Health Service CHR's are at the Wiyot Tribal Office on the second Wednesday of each month from 11:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. to test/monitor diabetes and check blood pressure.



Wiyot Tribal Council Meeting October

- Dan Kelly, Candidate for College of the Redwoods Board of Trustees Area 2 and Bonnie Deister Candidate for CR Trustees Area 1 each spoke about themselves, their experience and what they can do for College of the Redwoods. There was a short question and answer session with the candidates following each presentation.
- Cheryl A. Seidner spoke in public forum. She spoke about the vegetation behind her fence line; she hoped the fire lane would be mowed soon. She also requested the Natural resource department collect Native iris from her back yard to be dispersed elsewhere on the Reservation.
- Council approved a travel request for Stewart Atwell and George Buckley to attend Water treatment classes in Ukiah.
- Council directed staff to return with new quotes to replace the furnace in the big room of the Community center. The furnace has been out for several years.

Natural Resource staff brought the 5 year departmental plan titled Joint USEPA Tribal Environmental Plan (ETEP) to Council for review, NR staff will return in November for action on the plan.

- Natural Resource staff brought the Wiyot Tribe's integrated solid Waste Management Plan (ISWMP) to Council for review, NR staff will return in November for action on the plan.
- Council approved of a donation of \$100 to the 3rd Annual Indigenous People's Day Celebration in Forestville.
- Council approved the Cultural Ceremonial Camping Permit for the Indian Island Permit.
- Council directed staff to return with additional information about two Large Obsidian Dance Blades available for purchase.
- Council approved travel for Stewart Atwell to attend Indoor Air Quality Training paid for through a scholarship and EPA GAP funds.
- Council arbitrated a dispute with a former employee over vacation hours.


