## Wiyot Natural Resources Department Kicks off Integrated Resource Management Plan

The Wiyot Natural Resource Department (WNRD) was awarded a substantial sum of funding (75K) from the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) to draft an Integrated Resource Management Plan (IRMP) for the Table Bluff Reservation (TBR). This will be a major plan for TBR which will function as the Tribe’s strategic plan for the comprehensive management of its reservations resources. The IRMP provides a sound basis for the management of reservation resources using the Tribe’s vision for the reservation, and ties the natural environment to the Tribe’s social values.

This is an effort that will require a planning team representative of the spectrum of interests regarding TBR, particularly Wiyot Citizens, TBR residents, Wiyot departmental staff, and input from resource experts, local biologists, neighbors, historians, basket weavers, and elders. Resources at TBR known to be important to Tribal Citizens include both native plants and wildlife, and access for cultural gathering and hunting of food, herbs, basket, and ceremonial materials. Other values tied to the TBR landscape include opportunities for recreation, solitude, and ceremony, like the annual Wiyot Days celebration.

With all of these interests, values, and desired future outcomes for TBR, it is pertinent that this is an integrated and balanced plan, that has

input from Wiyot citizens. As first steps to the IRMP process, the WNRD will be reaching out to the Tribal Council, to initiate the “Charge to Plan”, which will specify the intentions of the plan and call together our group of decision makers that will really create the vision for the plan and TBR. We see the envisioning process as an amazing opportunity for Wiyots to set their goals for the desired future condition and state of the Reservation, ensuring that these resources remain for the future generations of Wiyot descendants.

One motto that rings true as you drive into TBR is the sign that reads “Respect the Land”. This embodies what we at the WNRD strive to do everyday in our work. Wiyot Ancestors depended upon a deep respect for the land and its resources for their survival, a reality that should be acknowledged even today, as Humboldt County remains an isolated jewel. The dependence on our highway and road systems and the trucks that ship in our foods and medicines represent a fragile and unsustainable delivery system, one that could be quickly annihilated by a Cascadia event. Wouldn’t it be amazing if Table Bluff could one day be traditional food secure, and host our important food and medicinal plants, used over the generations gone by? Maybe one day, elk could again roam the

Table Bluff prairies, Indian potato patches could grow as thick as grass, and iris beds and hazelnut orchards could blanket the hillsides. This is the opportunity to dream big and set our goals high for the eco-cultural restoration of our lands, and in turn, the restoration of the Wiyot people and culture.

To ensure integration and public involvement in the IRMP, the WNRD will be addressing the Wiyot Council in March to begin forming the IRMP Core Team. We will also be having a series of future public meetings and workshops throughout Wiyot Ancestral Territory as the planning process matures, to ensure that Wiyot citizens living off of the reservation have opportunities to contribute to the IRMP.

The WNRD will be posting a Resource Values and Interests survey on the Wiyot’s website sometime in March. 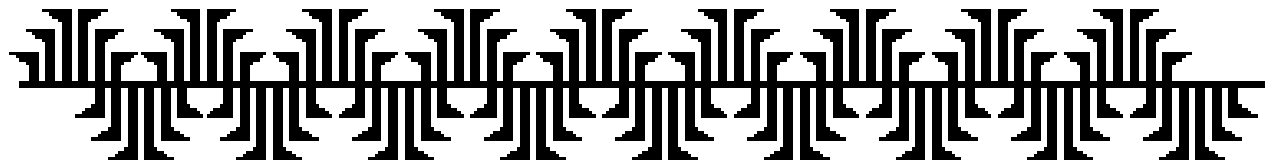
Salmonberry (*Rubus spectabilis*). An important Wiyot cultural food found at the Table Bluff Reservation.

## Employment Announcement-Natural Resources Youth Intern

The Wiyot Tribe Natural Resources Department (WNRD) is hiring a Natural Resources Youth Intern. Under supervision from WNRD staff the Intern will receive training in scientific data collection and management, calibration and care of scientific equipment, generation of resource management plans, grants management, environmental education, and general office duties, and will be expected to gradually assume independent completion of these tasks. The position will also assist the WNRD in a variety of duties as assigned including habitat restoration, fisheries surveys, collecting geospatial data, inputting scientific data, and much more. WNRD projects include wildlife, fisheries, botany, habitat restoration, water quality monitoring, environmental education, botanical surveys, solid waste management and waste reduction, renewable energy and efficiency, and non-point source pollution prevention. Occasional travel for trainings may be required and periodic field work in remote areas and marine environments is expected.

Desired applicant will be an enrolled Wiyot Tribal member between the ages of 14-20, however, all community youth are encouraged to apply. All applicants are subject to the Tribe's Drug and Alcohol Free Work Place Policy including pre-employment screening. All hiring is subject to the Wiyot Tribe's hiring preference.

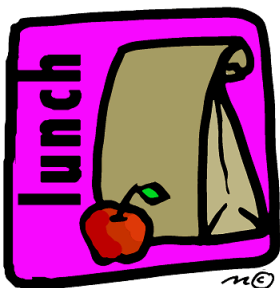

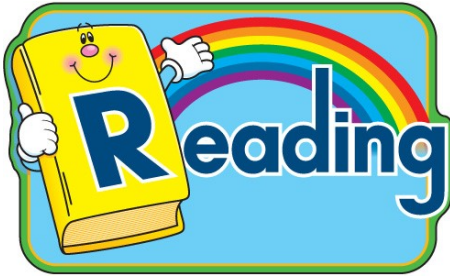

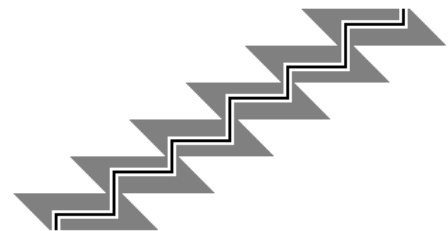
