

Congratulations to Re-elected Vice Chairman Brian Mead



Welcome back Dr. Lynnika Butler




We are excited to have Dr. Lynnika Butler back to work for the Tribe, she is our linguist and is underneath the cultural department, she was missed while she was away starting her family.

Natural Resources Department Reviews IRMP Survey Results: What do YOU Want for Table Bluff?

Greetings from the Wiyot Natural Resource Department (WNRD). We hope the beginning of the summer season has you outside and enjoying the best of what nature has to offer, our “natural air-conditioning”. As the interior begins to heat up we find solace in the cool and life-giving fog that makes its way off the Pacific (*shou’r*). The foggy micro-climate that characterizes Wiyot country in the summer is just one of the many natural drivers that makes this place unique and special, giving us monstrous redwood and Sitka spruce trees, delicious and bountiful berry crops, and a pleasant and enjoyable temperature for being outside. It is these natural qualities of this place that we want to provide and protect for our future generations. This is why the WNRD is reaching out to Tribal citizens to help us identify the resources YOU value most at the Table Bluff Reservation (TBR), as we draft the Tribe’s first Integrated Resource Management Plan (IRMP).

Our first step in getting community involvement in the IRMP was to distribute a resource interest survey in the April newsletter, which had a low response rate. In May we launched the survey online, which had a slightly better response rate. We would like to take this opportunity to inform you of our results (from 25 sur-

veys) and discuss the next steps in the IRMP planning process.

Possibly the most significant piece of data is that over 50% of respondents were tribal citizens living off of TBR.

This shows the value that TBR has to all Wiyots, regardless of whether or not one lives on the Reservation, and illustrates the importance of TBR’s natural resources to the greater Wiyot community. At the same time, landscape values for TBR may be different depending on whether or not you live on the Reservation or not. The task and challenge at hand is to integrate the values of all Wiyots into planning the desired future for Table Bluff, while also taking into account our neighbors and fostering balance within the broader ecological community, which is the definition of sustainability.

As for the preliminary results, there was no bias or sway by sex or age of the respondents. In general, the most universal emphasis for Land-Use focus remains with the WNRD core goals of protecting water quality on TBR as well as respondents expressing the need for emphasis toward protecting areas for eco-cultural preservation, where roads and development will not be permitted. Other trends in the survey showed that respondents generally want to see management for wildlife, fish/shellfish access, and cultural

plant/berry gathering on the Reservation (see figure 1). While providing job opportunities at TBR was important to over 75% of respondents, the development of commercial agriculture and tourism were only important to around 33%, suggesting that traditional eco-cultural land uses and related jobs have more value to Tribal citizens than does land development.

Specific wildlife and botanical management goals noted by respondents to be very important include promoting habitat for deer and other game animals as well as protected animals, like the bald eagle. Interestingly, elk-re-introduction did not have universal support by the response group. As for botanical resources, there was general interest in supporting habitat for both native cultural-use and food plants like huckleberry, salmonberry, Indian potatoes, and hazelnuts, as well as rare, threatened or endangered plants like the western lily (*Lilium occidentale*). This was reassuring to WNRD staff as native plant restoration has been a recent priority, with the goal to both reclaim native species and plant

communities within our pasturelands and provide cultural foods like berries and hazelnuts within walking distance on TBR.

The WNRD will be planning a community meeting and round-robin in the late summer/early fall to get more input for the IRMP and discuss these survey results in more detail, all of which will help us develop the primary goals and objectives of the plan. 




