Natural Resource Department Awarded St. Joseph Food Security Enhancement/Eco-Cultural Grant

The Wiyot Natural Resource Department (WNRD) was excited to get notice this month that it was awarded a 10K grant to improve food security at the Table Bluff Reservation (TBR). This grant will contribute and build upon previous food security and eco-cultural restoration projects funded by the St. Joseph Care for the Poor Community Grant Program, of which the Tribe is immensely grateful. This project will also help to leverage funding the WNRD has acquired through the Natural Resource Conservation Service (NRCS) for installing a hoop house in our community garden space, which will allow for increased year-round food production at TBR.

Other components of the grant include providing education to Tribal garden staff and assistance for the maintenance of perennial cultural food plants and Indian potato beds installed as part of last year's St. Joe's project. Some funds will be used to delineate and define cultural garden plantings, such as the newer plantings around the Wiyot Day site, where we hope to install a split-rail fence. If funding allows, we also hope to install additional rain catchment tanks at TBR to assist with dry season watering.

It is exciting and inspiring to be moving TBR toward becoming a more food-secure community, especially given our sovereign right and foundation support to work toward also bringing back Wiyot cultural food-plants to our lands. It is through connecting our future generations to healthy food, produced by a healthy environment that our culture is also preserved. Wishing everyone a fruitful 2019!

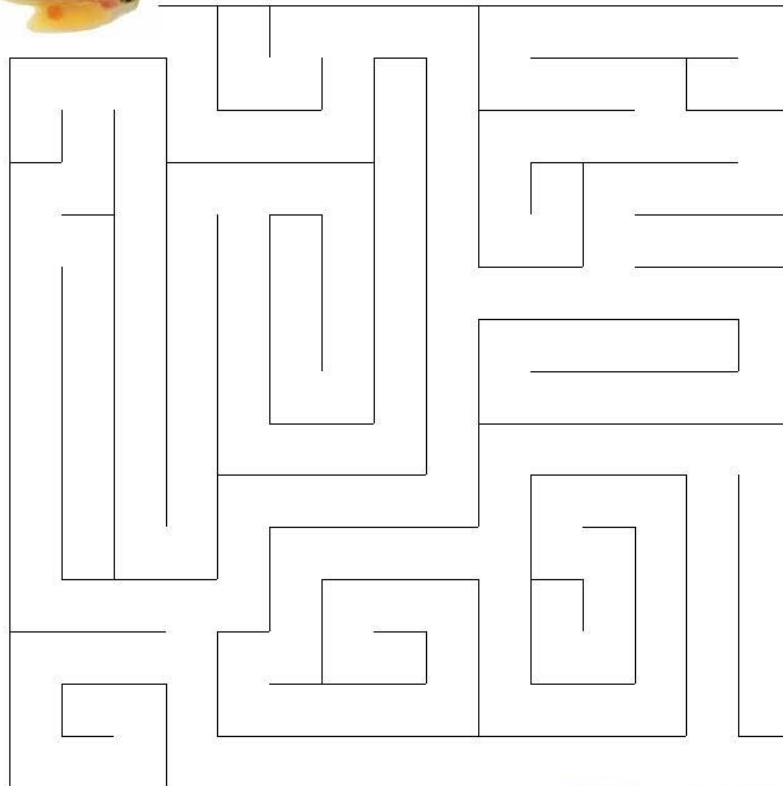

Nominations for Tribal Council

The following position is up for election in April of 2019, Treasurer and council member at large. Nominations for vacant Tribal Council position will be accepted at the Tribal office beginning January 1 and nominations end on January 15th, 2019. All nominations must be postmarked by or received in the Tribal office by close of business on January 15 in order to be valid. Nominations must be submitted in writing by one eligible voter and signed by the eligible tribal member nominee in accordance with Article IV of the Constitution. The nomination document must specify the following information: Submittal date of the nomination, name of the nominee, position to which the nominee wishes to be elected, name and signature of The person making the nomination, signature of the person being nominated, background (relations, number of meetings attended, committees or boards). Nomination forms are available at the Tribal office. Official notifications of qualified nominees will be listed in the February Tribal Newsletter. Between the months of February and April, but before the elections meeting all nominees will submit at least one article to the Tribal Newsletter or participate in at least one Town Hall meeting to discuss issues they and their constituents find important to the Tribe.
