Wiyot Tribe Offers Vaccination Incentive

The Wiyot Tribal Council approved a vaccination incentive program for all tribal citizens. This program will be funded with additional CARES Act funding that the Tribe received this year.

This incentive program is meant to encourage vaccination of tribal citizens and to gather information about rates of vaccination amongst the Wiyot Community. Each proof of COVID-19 vaccination would be eligible to receive \$100 up to \$300. This is a voluntary, ongoing program that will continue as vaccinations become available younger citizens.

To receive the incentive citizens must submit an application to the Wiyot Health and Human Services staff who will process the applications ensuring that individuals are enrolled tribal citizens. The medical records (immunization records) will be treated confidentially and used to collect vaccination rate data only. 5. Chimney Cleaning reimbursement (one per Wiyot household every 12 months)
6. Elders/Disabled wood: Elders/disabled Citizens get one cord per year from Men's Camp

The vaccine for COVID-19 has been deemed effective and vital to protect ourselves and our communities from this virus, and to end the pandemic.

To support the health of the Wiyot Tribe, we would like to thank you for getting your vaccination against COVID-19. Enrolled Citizens of the Tribe, no matter location, are eligible to receive up-to \$300 for getting vaccinated by completing an application and submitting a copy of the vaccination record.

- \$100 per vaccination for double-dose version, \$200 total
- \$200 per vaccination for single-dose version
- For those who receive a booster, and extra \$100

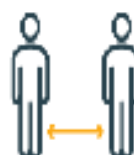







WIYOT TRIBE **EMERGENCY RENTAL ASSISTANCE** **PROGRAM**

We are proud to announce our own Emergency Rental Assistance program to assist Wiyot households during this pandemic.

This program is to alleviate the costs of rent and utilities if not explicitly a part of your rental agreement, including energy, water, garbage, and home telephone-Internet (*not cellular service*). This program is for those who pay rent, not those who pay a mortgage or own their home. Due to the nature of the program and emergency if you are already evicted or homeless having prior resided in a rental property this program can support a new rental or short-term hotel stay until you find a new residence.

To ensure that we meet the needs of the most citizens, we have an annual (12 months from first award) cap of \$1,500.00 per household.

A qualified applicant must:

- Be an enrolled member of the Wiyot Tribe, Table Bluff Reservation;
- Have one or more individuals within the household who has qualified for unemployment benefits or experienced a reduction in household income, incurred significant costs, or experienced other financial hardship due, directly or indirectly, to the COVID-19 outbreak;
- Be obligated to pay rent on a residential dwelling or be already evicted/homeless; and
- the household has a household income at or below 80% of area median income (ex. as of 2021 median annual household income in Humboldt is \$62,151).

To successfully apply, the application must be completed and have attached the required documents as indicated. Documentation cannot be dated no earlier than March 13, 2020.

If you are currently renting, payments will be made directly to the landlord. Ensure that the landlord contact and mailing information is provided in the application. A landlord may also apply on behalf of the household.

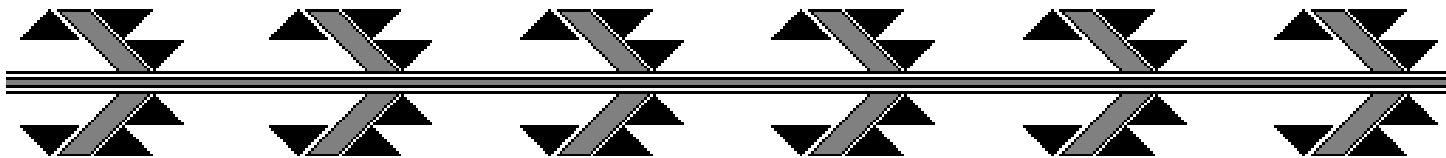
This program will accept applications until the deadline of September 30, 2025, or until funds have been exhausted, whichever comes first.

We hope that this program brings our Citizens some relief during this pandemic. We stand with you.

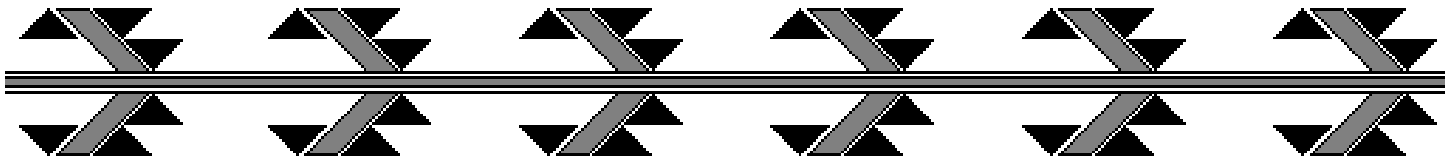

Cultural Department

NAGPRA is part of this department on returning our ancestors and artifacts in museums removed from our tribal lands in the past and present. We are in the process of bringing ancestors and ceremonial regalia home from Berkeley. We are taking precautions to bring these ancestors home during this pandemic crisis. We are collaborating with the staff at Berkeley on the transfer process. Once they are home, we will put out a news release. These ancestors and ceremonial regalia have been away far too long. The Brooklyn Museum is also working with this department to return a young girl's skirt to come back home. We are collaborating with their staff to make this transfer happen soon. We received an extension on our NAGPRA Grant till August 31, 2022. This will give us time to make sure that the dress is able to travel on plane with staff. We are also working with the University of Central Missouri on the return of three basket caps. We are just waiting for the federal register to be post. Once in the register we will be able to move the process much faster. We have working with the Maintenance Department and Administration on the new Da gou rou louwi' Cultural Center on moving items

into the building. We are excited and looking forward to sharing our culture and history with the communities surrounding us at the new center. The new center will be a great resource center for the Wiyot people and the community. We are planning to hold exciting cultural classes and language classes. We post when these classes start up in future newsletters or flyers. We hope to hold future regalia classes here soon for tribal members at our new Cultural center due to the size of the facility. We will be doing virtual courses until it is safe to do in a public setting. We partner with the Blue Ox Mill in Eureka to build our first dugout with the youth and tribal members. This project will start when this department and Blue Ox is finishes on the project they are on now. We be following all Covid-19 protocols to keep everyone safe. Please remember that this department will enforce all tribal policies when the youth are involved with these projects. We will be sending out notices when it comes closer to doing the workshop. The Cultural Department and Cultural center are looking for mentors to help with regalia courses, ceremony protocols, and other traditional courses. You will be working with the youth and adults on these pro-

jects. Mentors must come with good heart and good spirit. All mentors must go through proper background checks and requirements to be a mentor. If interested in being a mentor, contact the Cultural Department Director Ted Hernandez at ted@wiyot.us or Cultural Center manager Marnie Atkins at matkins@wiyot.us. The Cultural department Continues to work with our local Tribal THPOS, Local cities, Federal and County Governments on consultation projects, Section 106, Native Americans: California Environmental Quality Act (AB52), California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), and timber harvest plans (THP). This department has also been sending our tribal monitors on projects in Wiyot Ancestral Territory. During July, this department received and commented on thirty projects. We also had three tribal monitoring projects going on in July. We are also focusing on the removal of the Potter valley Dam project. Our Eel (Wiy'ot) river needs to have its water restored to come back to health for our salmon and eels. The Department is also assisting agencies with Traditional Land Acknowledgement language when they bring it to us to review for them. We are excited that communities are recognizing that they live and work on Wiyot land. There is so much happening in Wiyot territory.

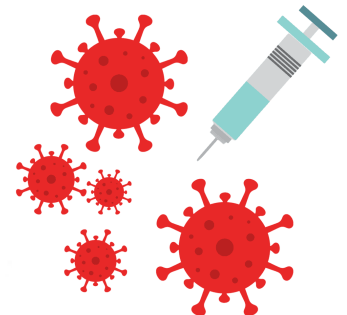

Table Bluff Water System Update

Table Bluff Reservation water system is running smoothly. Both wells are being used and we are currently tracking the drawdown at Well 2. We are taking routine water samples at the beginning of every month to North Coast Labs in Arcata. They are testing for the Presence/absence of any pathogens or chemicals. Another reminder for everyone, California is in an extreme drought. Residents please be mindful of your water usage.

(Please do not flush any foreign objects down the toilet)

HSU Food Sovereignty Lab

Friday October 8th, 2021, will go down in history. the HSU Food Sovereignty lab, “Rou Dalagurr”, the Wiyot name meaning “Work together”, had its groundbreaking/ribbon cutting ceremony. Located on what students are now calling “Wiyot Plaza,” near the Native American Forum, Goudi’ni Gallery and Behavioral and Social Sciences building.

Being the first of its kind in the state, the new lab — with remodeling underway and a goal opening date of fall 2022 — offers a space for all students to come together and learn about tradition foods, indigenous food sovereignty and much more.

Our Natural Resources Director Adam Canter is on the steering committee for the lab and spoke at the ceremony alongside Dr.Cutcha Risling-Baldy the NAS Chair, Kaitlin Reed, assistant professor NAS and Two grad students Carrie Tully and Cody Henrikson, who is Dena’ina, Sugpiaq and a member of the Ninilchik Village Tribe of Alaska.

Through the colonization of the Americas many people were removed from native land and restricted from speaking their language or having ceremonies, so many people lost touch with their culture, having only their native foods left.

“I lost those traditional foods and the connection to my culture, and I struggled a lot in my first few years of school. It took me a long time to adjust to this new environment and to become a good student,” Henrikson said.

Kaitlin Reed shared a statistic from Kari Norgaard’s book “Salmon and Acorns Feed Our People” that today’s average Karuk family eats less than five pounds of salmon per year, compared to the 400 pounds Karuk people ate per year prior to 1850.

Having this new lab and a place for native students to go will be a great asset to HSU and Humboldt County. We are so excited to see this place develop and the community benefit.

Ha'wa'lou everyone!

Lynnika has been working with Nina, a volunteer-turned-contractor with the Tribe, to develop Soulatluk language materials and lessons to use with youth at **Tsek Houdaqh**. Right now we are working on several short conversations asking & answering where different native animal species live (in the forest, in the river, etc.).

(Note: the same question, **Douwa daqh?** = *Where does s/he live?*, can be used to ask about people! In the near future we'll work on how to describe where humans live too ☺.)

Nina has created two booklets with these conversations, which include QR codes linking to native speaker + learner audio (**hou'** Marnie & Geneva!), and we'd like to make them available to everyone. The short version printed on the next two pages is about **pitsou'laksh** (Great Horned Owl), who lives in the forest/trees (**madiwaqh**). A longer version with both **pitsou'laksh** and **valhuk** (salmon), who lives in the **river** (lalilhwaqh), is available for you to download and print at: <https://www.wiyot.us/DocumentCenter/View/3239/Douwa-Daqh-Large-Booklet-Handout---NG>
