WIYOT MOUL ASSOCIATION IS CURRENTLY ACCEPTING APPLICATION FOR OWNERSHIP OF A THREE BEDROOM TWO BATH SINGLE-FAMILY HOME

The WIYOT MOUL (HOUSING) Association is currently accepting applications to own a three-bedroom two bath home on the Reservation. To be considered all applications and income verification must be POSTMARKED no later than December 15, 2022 or delivered to the Tribal office by 4 pm on December 15, 2022.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE? An applicant must meet all of the following requirements at the time of application, be an enrolled member of the Wiyot Tribe; be at least 18 years of age or over as of the date of application for assignment; be without an assignment of Tribal land or similar land use right from this or any Indian tribe; provided, that an undivided ownership interest in a trust allotment obtained through inheritance shall not affect eligibility under this criteria; not have had a previous assignment canceled for cause within one year from the date of application. [Ord. 5-91 Art. VII, approved 3/11/91.]

WHO CAN BENEFIT? With certain limited exceptions, funds may be used to benefit only Indian families whose income does not exceed 80% of median income (defined to mean the greater of the median income for the Indian area, as determined by the Secretary of HUD, or the median income of the United States). The right of tribes to give preference to their own members in providing housing assistance is expressly recognized in NAHASDA.

* The FY 2014 Consolidated Appropriations Act changed the definition of extremely low-income to be the greater of 30/50ths (60 percent) of the Section 8 very low-income limit or the poverty guideline as [established by the Department of Health and Human Services \(HHS\)](#), provided that this amount is not greater than the Section 8 50% very low-income limit. Consequently, the extremely low income limits may equal the very low (50%) income limits.

The chosen application will require background checks for all adult household members to screen out state registered lifetime sex offenders this has been a requirement by statutory law since June 25, 2001. This requirement was announced in HUD Notice 02-22, released on October 29, 2002. HUD Notice H 2012-11, issued by HUD on June 11, 2012, re-confirmed that applicants subject to a lifetime state sex offender registration requirement cannot be admitted to federal housing programs. It also requires immediate eviction of tenants who were admitted in error (i.e., management did not identify that they were on offender registries, beginning June 25, 2001). Once selected the applicant will be required to complete homeowner training.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE HOMEOWNER: The homeowner shall be responsible for all maintenance of the home, including all repairs and replacements (including normal wear and tear those necessitated by damage from any cause). If outside workman or contractors are needed to make necessary repairs, it shall be the responsibility of the homeowner to obtain their services. Adequate homeowners' insurance (fire and property damage) will be carried at the homeowner's own expense and the homeowner shall provide to the TRIBE a certification of said insurance prior to taking possession of the new home. A separate statement acknowledging the requirement for homeowners' insurance shall be signed by the homeowner.

PENALTIES FOR HOMEOWNER VIOLATIONS: Penalties for violation of the agreement shall include Repayment by the Homeowner of the cost to build the home. If violation occurs within 0 to 10 years of initial occupancy, the full amount of the grant must be repaid. If violation occurs within 11 to 20 years of initial occupancy, 90% of the original amount must be repaid. After 20 years of initial occupancy, no repayment.

Cancellation of the Homeowners tribal assignment, which, subject to Sect. 5.2 of the Assignment Ordinance, could result in forfeiture of the home constructed thereon for reassignment to another eligible grantee. Imposition of punitive actions by the Tribal Council, such as withdrawal of eligibility to participate in tribal programs and privileges.

HOW WILL THE APPLICATIONS BE SELECTED? The MOUL Association will review applications submitted by the deadline that are complete all questions answered, and income verification documents are attached. Applicants that meet the eligibility/beneficiary requirements will be numbered. A lottery will be conducted, and the winning number will receive notification to complete the screenings required to move forward. Once the home is awarded, the new homeowner will be required to move in within 30 days.

Please remember to complete **ALL** questions and do not leave any areas blank. It is **CRITICAL** that all income verification documents are completed and submitted along with the application for all citizens 18 years of age or older. Incomplete applications will not be processed.

Furthermore, all applications and income verification must be **POSTMARKED** no later than December 15, 2022 or submitted in person at the Tribal Office before close of business at 4:00 P.M. on Thursday December 15, 2022.

- enrolled Wiyot tribal members, children of enrolled tribal members/staff employees, or who live within a 30-mile radius of the reservation.







Understanding North Coast Ocean Acidification

Last week the Wiyot Tribe Natural Resources Department (WNRD) attended a two-day meeting convened by the California Current Acidification Network (C-CAN) which was sponsored by the National Ocean and Atmospheric Association (NOAA). This network was developed in 2010 from a shared concern among scientists, industry, tribes, and government agencies about changing levels of ocean acidity and dissolved oxygen levels.

Ocean acidification is directly linked to the amount of human generated carbon dioxide (CO_2) released into the atmosphere. The ocean is a sink for this atmospheric CO_2 , meaning that it can absorb and store this gas. Unfortunately, the amount of CO_2 being stored in the ocean is having complex negative impacts on ocean chemistry and biology. This change has direct impacts on sea creatures that build shells, such as crabs, snails, and mussels. The increased acidity causes holes to form during the shell building process. The WNRD learned that these impacts are not well understood and that there is a need for more data collection on ocean chemistry and biology.

The North Coast is a data gap. This means that there is a lack of data collection and distribution. There is an opportunity to support the effort to better understand ocean acidification by collecting data in and around Wigi. Alex Harper, a researcher that hosted the meeting referred to our part of the coastline as a “refuge” due to the upwelling of deep cold water from offshore. If more data is collected in this region, it would be added to the research that is informing state and federal regulations on ocean acidification.

Why does this matter? Currently we don’t understand how ocean acidification is indirectly affecting other cultural resources like salmon, eels, sturgeons, and other fishes that spend some of their life in the ocean. The goal of the workshop was to initiate relationships between industries, tribes, researchers, and agencies in and around the Wiyot ancestral lands and waters. The Wiyot Tribe has an opportunity to fill the data gaps by working with these partners to better understand the impacts of ocean acidification on our coastline and provide input to state and federal decision-making surrounding this topic.

Wiyot Natural Resources Department (WNRD) Celebrate another Year of Environmental

As we roll into the shortest days of the year, it's a good time to give thanks and take stock of where we've been and what we've accomplished as well as the important work that lays ahead. The WNRD saw a large staff turnover this year, which brought in reinvigorated passion with new and experienced staff to carry on the environmental stewardship role of the WNRD. We have built the WNRD's fisheries capacity to restore the Wiyot's sacred and biologically rich watersheds by bringing on Dr. Bill Matsubu back in December 2021. Bill has done amazing work this year expanding efforts to benefit salmonids and lamprey through researching successful techniques of removing the invasive non-native predatory Sacramento pikeminnow in the South Fork Eel River. Bill helped to bring on Fisheries Technician's Marisa McGrew and Alex Juan, whose stellar work ethics helped bring success to the WNRD's NOAA Pacific Coastal Salmon Recovery Fund (PCSRF) project, by also securing addition awarded funds to build fisheries capacity in 2023 as well as securing funds through the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service Tribal Wildlife Grant (TWG), which will allow the Tribe to pick back up on it's lamprey conservation work throughout ancestral watersheds. Bill and the Fisheries team have worked hard this year expanding our partnerships with the Bureau of Land Management (BLM), CDFW, and Cal Trout so that we can expand the Tribe's stewardship role across Wiyot Country. The WNRD also sampled the Wigi every month in 2022 for fish plankton to assess potential entrainment impacts from the proposed Nordic Aquafarms land-based fish farm, and will continue to monitor project plans. Other highlights this year include a successful WNRD proposal award through the Ocean Protection Council (OPC) Prop 1 Environmental Justice Program to reclaim 46 acres which includes the historic Wiyot village site of Mouralherwaqh near King Salmon at the base of Humboldt Hill (Wolf's House) and hosts over 13 acres of freshwater wetlands and pieces of majestic Sitka spruce forest, berry patches, Redwood manzanita, and even hazelnut thickets. We are excited to take on the next phase of the OPC grant which includes Wiyot citizen, staff, and students from Cal Poly Humboldt Native American Studies and Environmental Science programs who will work collaboratively at the Tribe's direction to develop an Eco-Cultural Restoration and Management Plan for the property. We were also excited this year to bring on the Wiyot's first Forest Resources Specialist, Zach Erickson, who will be focusing on the stewardship of the Mouralherwaqh forest. Some early identified goals include forest restoration and invasive species removal to remedy impacts from a partial timber harvest of the property in 2014, as well as enhancement of its wetland functions and culturally important plant populations. Please stay tuned for events and planning field trips to the property, which we will keep updated through the Wiyot website and WNRD Facebook and Instagram pages, as well as upcoming Community Advisory Committee (CAC) meetings, including the upcoming meeting on December 6th at 5:30 p.m. on zoom. Check the Wiyot website Meetings panel for zoom log in information and spread the word to others to encourage participation in planning for this exciting and beautiful new re-acquisition of Wiyot ancestral lands.

Other annual highlights include participating in offshore wind engagement and advocating for Tribal Trust Resource protections, marine monitoring, and community benefits related to the proposed wind energy development in a 200 square mile area 21-29 miles off the Humboldt Coast. This will be a major on-shore development project as well that the WNRD will be keeping tabs on and working to mitigate impacts.

Our climate adaptation and resilience efforts continue as we work on Phase 1 of the Tribe’s Climate Change Adaptation Plan (CCAP), funded thru the OPC Prop 68 Coastal Resilience Program. To build the resilience at Table Bluff this fall we successfully installed backup generators at the lift station and well 2, and we rest assured to have Brian Mead as our Water Operator in Training, who will be taking over from veteran George Buckley, who has provided clean drinking water to TBR for decades. Stay tuned for how to participate in WNRD projects on this exciting year ahead. We at the WNRD are honored to serve the Wiyot and wish you all a Happy Winter solstice and healthy New Year in 2023.
