<b>'</b>	<b>Not a (spelled) sound in English.</b> <i>The sound in the middle of 'uh-oh'</i>	hou'l	<a href="#">bcicya</a>
<b>gh</b>	<b>Not a sound in English.</b> <i>A little like 'g' in go but MUCH softer. (Try pretending to gargle very softly.)</i>	highuchk	<a href="#">bcmB3U</a>
<b>lh</b>	<b>Not a sound in English.</b> <i>Place your tongue in the same position as for 'l'; then blow air out the sides. (Sounds like a hissing cat!)</i>	lhelhaqi'	<a href="#">bcmB7m</a>
<b>rr</b>	<b>Not a (spelled) sound in English.</b> <i>muddy, matter (spoken casually)</i>	rruni'	<a href="#">bclXZb</a>
